Governor Susana Martinez Announces Appointments

Santa Fe, NM – Today, Governor Susana Martinez announced appointments to the Dona Ana County Magistrate Court, the Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists, the State Rehabilitation Council for the Commission for the Blind, the Border Authority, the Children’s Trust Fund Board of Trustees, the Crime Victims Reparation Commission, the New Mexico Family Infant Toddler Interagency Coordinating Council, the Judicial Standards Commission, the Nutrition and Dietetics Practice Board, the State Rehabilitation Council, the Soil and Water Conservation Commission, and the Speech Language Pathology, Audiology and Hearing Aid Dispensing Practices Board.

William Kinsella of Las Cruces has been appointed to Division II of the Dona Ana Magistrate Court. The appointment fills the vacancy created by the resignation of Judge Jeanne H. Quintero, who was recently appointed to the Third Judicial District Court by the Governor. Kinsella has over 20 years of legal experience. Previously, he served as a senior trial attorney for the Third Judicial District Attorney’s Office in Las Cruces. He has also served as a prosecutor in district attorneys’ offices in Alamogordo and Socorro and as a public defender in Clovis. He currently serves as a special commissioner for domestic violence in district court. He holds a Juris Doctorate from the University of New Mexico School of Law in Albuquerque.
