Senate Republicans Leaders Respond to Latest Leadership Turnover at Public Education Department

SANTA FE – Following the announcement by Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham that Public Education Department Secretary Ryan Stewart is stepping down, Senate Republican leaders today released the following statement:
