



Winter Storm Advisory Until Noon Thursday

February 1, 2022—The National Weather Service has issued a winter storm warning for central and north-central New Mexico from 5 p.m. today through Thursday noon. Heavy snowfall and cold temperatures, coupled with winds, are expected to deliver below-zero wind chills for several days.

The weather could be dangerous, and life-threatening; please keep pets and other animals safe.

Travel could become very challenging. Some roads may be closed and significant travel delays are possible. The hazardous conditions are expected to impact commuting Wednesday morning through Thursday morning.

City of Santa Fe snow removal crews are scheduled for 24-hour activity throughout the storm and cleanup. The Snow and Ice Control Plan policy executes a systematic, three-tier priority process for maintaining road safety and mobility. The intent is to safely move the majority of the City's traffic on major roads and provide access to police, fire stations, hospitals, major medical facilities, senior centers, and schools. Note that roadways that are not priority 1, 2, or 3 will only be cleared after all priority roads are in good shape.

Priority 1 Streets: Main arterials provide access for police, fire, buses, and other emergency vehicles.

Priority 2 Streets: Commercial routes.

Priority 3 Streets: Include some residential streets.

Important reminders:

- As of Tuesday afternoon, trash and recycling are expected to take place on normal Wednesday schedules.
- Santa Fe Municipal Court follows City delay protocols.
- Residents and businesses have the responsibility to shovel sidewalks adjacent to their homes and businesses.
- Keep pets safe from freezing conditions.
- Snow and ice accumulations on overhead power lines can cause the lines to break and fall to the ground. **Do not touch downed or sagging power lines**, and consider them, and anything touching them, energized and dangerous. Stay as far away as possible and immediately contact PNM at 888-DIAL-PNM (888-342-5766).
- If the power may be out for a prolonged period, plan to go to another location (the home of a relative or friend, or a public facility) that has heat to keep warm.

City of Santa Fe Snow Removal Services Areas




