**Eagle Nest Lake:** The lake is now open to ice fishing; however, it is restricted to foot traffic only. Avoid ice fishing near feeder streams or known springs, brush, logs, plants or docks, or areas with multiple cracks or ice that is popping or otherwise weak. Ice measurements are holding

from 7-11 inches of total ice and 5-7 inches of clear, strong ice, though ice was only measured in the middle of the lake. For updated lake conditions, visit the <u>park's webpage</u> or call the park office at 575-377-1594.

**Eagle Rock Lake:** We had no reports from anglers this week.

**Hopewell Lake:** Ice fishing for trout was very good when using small jigs tipped with wax worms.

Lake Alice: The lake surface is closed due to unsafe ice conditions.

Lake Maloya: The ADA dock is open to anglers, with priority given to mobility-impaired persons.

Los Pinos River: We had no reports from anglers this week.

Maxwell Lake 13: Closed until March 1.

**Red River:** Streamflow below the Red River Hatchery on Monday morning was 36 cubic feet per second (cfs).

**Rio Grande:** Streamflow below the Taos Junction Bridge on Monday morning was 387 cfs. Fishing for trout was good when using rainbow trout-pattern Streamer flies, bright-colored Streamer flies and white Streamer flies. Fishing for pike was fair to good when using green, size-6 Panther Martin spinners.

Rio Hondo: Streamflow near Valdez Monday morning was not measured due to ice.

Rio Mora: Streamflow near Terrero Monday morning was not measured due to ice.

Rio Pueblo: Streamflow near Peñasco Monday morning was not measured due to ice.

# Tips, Tricks and Stories - Attaching a Fly to Your Spinner or Spoon

Spiff up your favorite spinner or spoon with a fly and create your own fish catching combination. Sometimes a small fly attached to your spinner/spoon works good and other times a larger fly such as a Woolly Bugger is what adds the extra enticement that it takes to get the fish to bite.

For this example, I am using a Kastmaster spoon and adding a black Woolly Bugger fly. This will create the 3 to 4-inch lure that I am using to target trout and pike. You can troll or cast this lure.



- 1. Remove the treble hook from the O-ring of the spoon and leave the O-ring attached to the spoon.
- 2. Thread the eye of the Woolly Bugger hook onto the O-ring of the spoon.



It is that simple! As you could imagine, there are tons of different spoon/spinner/fly combinations you can create. I have had good success using brown and black flies in combination with my spinners and spoons.

This is also an easy way to turn a spinner/spoon with a treble hook into a single hook that can be de-barbed and fished in quality waters where such fishing restrictions exist.
