NM Environmental Groups Praises Haaland's Secretarial Orders on Climate, Energy

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Interior Secretary Haaland <u>today</u> issued two executive orders prioritizing <u>action on climate change</u> and <u>revoking Trump administration policies</u> promoting fossil fuel development over the health of communities and the outdoors. The orders ensure that the social cost of carbon and other climate pollution is considered in decision making, and instructs agencies within the Department of the Interior not to adhere to the Trump-era regulations implementing the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). They also focus on economic justice and a just transition for communities most reliant on fossil fuels.

In response NM Environmental Groups issued the following statements.

"The age of Trump's devastating energy dominance regime is over. Secretary Haaland is leading the way to justice for people, our communities, the climate, our air and our water. Centering tribal consultation, public participation, science and the social cost of carbon are key steps to ensuring a habitable planet for ourselves and future generations."
