Santa Fe National Forest Fires Pose No Immediate Threat to City of Santa Fe and Residents

SANTA FE, April 25 – Smoke from the Cerro Pelado Fire and Hermit's Peak / Calf Canyon Fire will be visible from the city of Santa Fe until later this afternoon. **At this time, the fires pose no immediate threat to the city of Santa Fe or our residents.**

The National Weather Service - Albuquerque's air quality alert for the Santa Fe region ended at 12 p.m. today. Residents should [utilize the 5-3-1 visibility method](#) to gauge smoke levels and protect their health. The SFNF has also implemented [Stage II Fire Restrictions](#).
