KOAT 7 LAUNCHING CELEBRATION OF 70 YEARS BROADCASTING WITH SPECIAL FOCUSED ON STATION'S EARLY DAYS OF TELEVISION

ALBUQUERQUE, NM – KOAT 7 is embarking on a year-long campaign to celebrate 70 years of broadcasting to the entire state of New Mexico. On October 2nd, of 1953, launching at 7:00 p.m., KOAT filled televisions with movies, variety shows and local news. The last 7 decades have presented constant change and evolution of the industry. From 15-minute newscasts to today's 40-plus hours of news each week. Since that inaugural broadcast, KOAT has soared to become the leading source for news and entertainment.

Throughout 2023, KOAT 7 will present specials and series that look back at the big stories in the last 70 years. On January 19th, the first of these specials will air. It focuses on the early beginnings of KOAT 7, the important moments that impacted the state, and the people at KOAT 7 that pushed journalism forward. KOAT Action 7 News will also run segments devoted to the "Video Vault". Unsealing unique footage from the archives, some not seen in years, to offer insight into timely connections to the past and behind-the-scenes operations.
